Secondary School Workshop Guide



Who we are:

Soar creates and delivers preventative, character building programmes for teenagers from all backgrounds. We create safe, non-judgemental environments for teenagers to explore who they are and who they want to become.



What we aim to do:

Our workshops empower young people to thrive, believe in themselves and fulfil their potential. We create a space where young people can be themselves, explore their dreams and some of the things that might be holding them back.

Soar's programme's aim to support young people developing the following:

- Connection
- Resilience
- Relationships
- Confidence
- Self-awareness
- Purpose

What happens in a Soar Workshop:

During the Workshop:

- Our highly trained Soar facilitators deliver a 3-hour experiential workshop with great care and skill.
- We create an awareness of what influences us and stops us being who we want to be.
- We provide a structured environment where young people feel free to have honest conversations.
- We encourage young people to express themselves authentically and create a space where it is safe for them to do so.
- The group are given the opportunity to explore and claim a future for themselves without any societal limitations.
- Young people acknowledge and share the strength and value they see in one another.

Things we avoid:

- We never tell young people what to say, think or feel.
- We don't offer answers but help the groups to support one another and share their wisdom from their life experience.

After the Workshop:

- The facilitators carry out a robust handover with the care team before departing from the school.
- Our team will be in touch after the workshop to support you and obtain your feedback to ensure we are continuously improving our workshops.
- We will link you to our resource page for anyone who may need extra support.

What to expect:

- Our team will arrive at 9:15 am to set up the room.
- Our workshops are 3-3.5 hours in duration. We aim to conclude by 1pm but due to the nature of our work, it is hard to predict the flow of each section. Please allow an additional few minutes to ensure a proper closure of the workshop for the young people.
- This time will also include a handover with the member of staff that was
 present for the morning to ensure continuity of care, if required, after the
 Soar Team leave. It is imperative that the same member of staff is present
 for the duration of the workshop.

Workshop Fees:

Group sizes will be capped at 50. Often, we can try to run consecutive workshops.



Soar require one month's notice if you have to reschedule or cancel your workshop, otherwise we will have incur a 50% charge on the overall fee of the workshop.

How to make your workshop a success:

1 - Find the best room

Help us make your workshop more powerful and effective by finding the most suitable room in your school.

The ideal room needs to:

- Feel intimate and comfortable: Is there some room other than a giant hallway or a gym?
- Be removed from distraction and external loud noises or interruptions.
- Please ensure the young people are not in the room while it is being set up.

2 - Room Set Up

- Have a seat for every young person in the group.
- Seats to be set up in curved rows, with a gap down the middle, facing the whiteboard and projector if possible (please see images below).
- Projector, flipchart/whiteboard, markers and a table (please let us know if you don't have a projector).
- Somewhere suitable to project. A bare wall for example.
- Have a sign on the door stating, 'room is in use'.



3 - Pre and post Workshop support

- When your workshop date has been finalized, you will be sent a series of questions about the group.
- If you wish to discuss these over the phone, please call our Bookings Administrator on 085-8504212 or if unavailable, our Programme Manager on 085-8565458.
- After the workshop is over, please note that you can call Soar to discuss any signposting or follow-up queries long after the workshop has ended. We are here to support you in supporting your young people over the entire school year.

4 - Uniform Free Day

From our experience this has a positive impact on the workshops as the young people are more at ease, relaxed and open. Wearing the school tracksuit/PE gear is also encouraged if the uniform must be worn.
